**Calls for Service** 3019 calls for service  
YTD 19,165 calls citywide.  
(Average 90 calls per day, or 30 calls per 8 hr shift, seven days per week)

**Vehicle and Traffic Enforcement** 644 traffic tickets issued during this time period. YTD 3297 traffic tickets issued citywide.  
(Average 16 traffic tickets per day, seven days per week)

**Arrests** 246 total adult arrests this period YTD 1904

An average of 35 parking tickets were written per day, seven days per week.

**Vehicle Accidents** 105 reported and investigated YTD 792  
(Average 4 accidents investigated per day, seven days per week.)

### **172 Broadway**

A patrol plan has been put into place to create a high visibility enforcement of all criminal and quality of life violations in the area in front of 160 to 190 Broadway. There have been 2,217 arrests within this targeted area from January 1, 1996 to present. 11 arrests were effected during this report period. 85 total arrests have been effected YTD 2010.

**Dubois Street** (between Broadway and Third Street) 8 arrests during this period. 87 arrests have been effected YTD 2010. Officers have effected 993 arrests in this area since June 8, 1998.

**South Street** (between Grand Street and North Miller) Officers have effected: 8 arrests during this period, with 29 arrests YTD 2010.

With their emphasis on visibility, officers have effected:  
888 total arrests in this targeted area since June 6, 1998.

**Johnston Street** (entire length) Patrol plan with emphasis on disorderly conduct, narcotics violations, loud music, and illegal loitering. There was 2 arrests during the period of this report with 35 arrests YTD 2010. Officers have effected 1,483 arrests in this targeted area since January 1, 2002.

**South Lander Street** (entire length) Patrol plan with emphasis on illegal loitering, narcotics violations, disorderly conduct and loud music. There were 5 arrests during the period of this report with 22 arrests YTD 2010. Officers have effected 184 arrests in this targeted area since January 1, 2002.

**Chamber Street** (entire length) Patrol plan with emphasis on narcotics violations, illegal loitering, disorderly conduct and loud music. There were 7 arrests during the period of this report with 39 arrests YTD 2010. Officers have effected 720 arrests in this targeted area since January 1, 2002.

**Lander Street** (entire length) Patrol plan with emphasis on narcotics violations, illegal loitering, disorderly conduct and loud music. There were 8 arrests during the period of this report with 61 arrests YTD 2010. Officers have effected 1,037 arrests in this targeted area since January 1, 2002.

**Renwick Street** (entire length) Patrol plan with emphasis on narcotics violations, illegal loitering, disorderly conduct and loud music. There were 3 arrests during the period of this report with 80 arrests YTD 2010. Officers have effected 514 arrests in this targeted area since January 1, 2002.

**Benkard Ave** (entire length) Patrol plan with emphasis on narcotics violations, illegal loitering, disorderly conduct, and loud music. There were 6 arrests during the period of this report with 34 arrests YTD 2010. Officers have effected 347 arrests in this targeted area since January 1, 2002.

**Liberty Street Flats** Patrol Plan with emphasis on narcotics and prostitution violations, open container, loud music and disorderly conduct. There were 2 arrests during the time of this report and 34 arrests since January 1, 2010. Officers have made 477 arrests in the area of the Liberty Street Flats since Jan. 1, 2004.

**William Street** (between Broadway and Renwick Street)  
With a strong emphasis on visibility and quality of life, officers effected:  
15 arrests during this period, with 118 arrests YTD 2010.  
2,175 total arrests were effected in this targeted area since September 1, 1998.

**Prostitution Enforcement** (Citywide) Prostitution related offenses have in the past been the source of several complaints. This department will continue to take citywide action to arrest those involved. During the period of this report there were 2 prostitution arrests affected with 18 arrests YTD 2010 and 1,091 total prostitution related arrests since Jan. 1, 1998.

**The City of Newburgh Police participate in  
Orange County STOP DWI**

STOP-DWI stands for “Special Traffic Options Program for Driving While Intoxicated”. The STOP-DWI program was enacted by the State Legislature in 1981 for the purpose of empowering and coordinating local efforts to reduce alcohol and other drug-related traffic crashes within the context of a comprehensive and financially self-sustaining statewide alcohol and highway safety program. The STOP-DWI legislation permits each of the state’s 62 counties to establish a county STOP-DWI Program which qualifies the county for the return of all fines collected for alcohol and other drug-related traffic offenses occurring in its jurisdiction.

All 62 counties have opted to participate. Each county appoints a STOP-DWI Coordinator, whose duties include the development of a program and the coordination of efforts by agencies involved in alcohol and highway safety.

**STOP DWI Grants**

**Spring of 2009 75 hrs, \$2,363.00**

48 hours were used to make 8 patrol shifts. Officers made (36) traffic stops, (6) DWI arrests, (8) 1192 tickets were written, (1 suspended license arrest was made and (20) other violations were issued.

**Summer of 2009 75 hrs, \$2,399.00**

73 hours were used to make 11 patrol shifts. Officers made (69) traffic stops, (8) DWI arrests, (15) 1192 tickets were written, (2) suspended license arrests were made and (63) other violations were issued.

**Fall of 2009 70 hrs, \$2,239.00**

70 hours were used to make 10 patrol shifts. Officers made (72) traffic stops, (3) DWI arrests, (5) 1192 tickets were written, (0) suspended license arrests were made and (55) other violations were issued.

**Spring 2010 55 hrs, \$1,768.00**

55 hours were used to make 8 patrol shifts. Officers made (43) traffic stops, (8) DWI arrests, (15) 1192 tickets were written, (3) suspended license arrests were made and (44) other violations were issued.

**Summer 2010 75 hrs, \$3,675.00**

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
