The City provides public education and outreach through direct mailing of pamphlets & quarterly water quality reports, targeted & location or event specific outdoor signs, kiosks, storm drain markers, posters, press releases, workshops, water conservation day, international waterfront festivals, Earth Day & school programs as well as meetings & projects coordinated by the Youth Bureau VISTA, Downing Park commission, Shade Tree Commission, Orange County Soil & Water, & Quassaick Creek Watershed Coalition to reach a broad audience of different age groups and interests related to stormwater management & water quality issues. Best Management Practices, Federal, State & local guidelines, and any public-private partnership or funding opportunities are informed and enforced by the building inspectors, planning board members, and the City Engineer.

Public education and outreach have been and will continue to be important on-going activities. The City will look for new opportunities to educate the public about stormwater management and water resources protection. The City Engineer, City Planner and Planning Board members will continue to encourage internal staff and private contractors and landscapers to implement more best management practices whenever possible.

The City Manager has been designated as the official contact point for information pertaining to the SWMPP. Assistance to citizens, residents and builders has been provided by the Planning Board members, City Engineer, City Planner, building inspectors and commissions, environmental groups, and partners such as Orange County Soil & Water and Orange County Water Authority.

To document the City's stormwater system, implement an illicit discharge detection & elimination plan, and to enact a local stormwater ordinance that foster all of the goals and intended results covered in the SWMPP. The City's digital storm and sewer system maps and data were completed in early 2007. Dye testing for the location of illicit connections to the City's storm and sewer collection system are performed and evaluated when suspected illicit discharges are identifiable. Responsible staff receive periodic training and are required to maintain their certifications. The City's stormwater ordinance was adopted in 2007.

Building officers issue proper permits & follow up with periodic inspections.

The City will continue to adhere to NYS DEC stormwater rules and regulations as well as to encourage best management practices for all projects in the City.
