Calls for Service 2516 calls for service

An average of 68 parking tickets were written per day, seven days per week.

Vehicle Accidents 124 reported and investigated YTD 443 *(Average / 3 accidents investigated per day, seven days per week.)*

172 Broadway (Area of Kennedy Chicken)

A patrol plan has been put into place to create a high visibility enforcement of all criminal and quality of life violations in the area in front of 160 to 190 Broadway. There have been 2,445 arrests within this targeted area from January 1, 1996 to present. 9 arrests were documented during this report period. 39 total arrests have been acknowledged YTD 2013.

Dubois Street (between Broadway and Third Street) 6 arrests during this period. 21 arrests have been effected YTD 2013. Officers have effected 1,125 arrests in this area since June 8, 1998.

South Street (between Grand Street and North Miller) Officers have effected: 3 arrests during this period, with 6 arrests YTD 2013. With their emphasis on visibility, officers have effected: 963 total arrests in this targeted area since June 6, 1998.

Johnston Street (entire length) Patrol plan with emphasis on disorderly conduct, narcotics violations, loud music, and illegal loitering. There was 3 arrests during the period of this report with 6 arrests YTD 2013. Officers have effected 1,553 arrests in this targeted area since January 1, 2002.

South Lander Street (entire length) Patrol plan with emphasis on illegal loitering, narcotics violations, disorderly conduct and loud music. There were 3 arrests during the period of this report with 3 arrests YTD 2013. Officers have effected 255 arrests in this targeted area since January 1, 2002.

Chamber Street (entire length) Patrol plan with emphasis on narcotics violations, illegal loitering, disorderly conduct and loud music. There were 3 arrests during the period of this report with 12 arrests YTD 2013. Officers have effected 842 arrests in this targeted area since January 1, 2002.

Lander Street (entire length) Patrol plan with emphasis on narcotics violations, illegal loitering, disorderly conduct and loud music. There were 10 arrests during the period of this report with 20 arrests YTD 2013. Officers have effected 1,179 arrests in this targeted area since January 1, 2002.

Renwick Street (entire length) Patrol plan with emphasis on narcotics violations, illegal loitering, disorderly conduct and loud music. There were 9 arrests during the period of this report with 20 arrests YTD 2013. Officers have effected 690 arrests in this targeted area since January 1, 2002.

Benkard Ave (entire length) Patrol plan with emphasis on narcotics violations, illegal loitering, disorderly conduct, and loud music. There were 4 arrests during the period of this report with 8 arrests YTD 2013. Officers have effected 460 arrests in this targeted area since January 1, 2002.

Liberty Street Flats Patrol Plan with emphasis on narcotics and prostitution violations, open container, loud music and disorderly conduct. There were 6 arrests during the time of this report and 21 arrests since January 1, 2013. Officers have made 605 arrests in the area of the Liberty Street Flats since Jan. 1, 2004.

William Street (between Broadway and Renwick Street) With a strong emphasis on visibility and quality of life, officers effected: 9 arrests during this period, with 32 arrests YTD 2013. 2,432 total arrests were effected in this targeted area since September 1, 1998.

Orange County STOP DWI**

STOP-DWI stands for "Special Traffic Options Program for Driving While Intoxicated". The STOP-DWI program was enacted by the State Legislature in 1981 for the purpose of empowering and coordinating local efforts to reduce alcohol and other drug-related traffic crashes within the context of a comprehensive and financially self-sustaining statewide alcohol and highway safety program. The STOP-DWI legislation permits each of the state's 62 counties to establish a county STOP-DWI Program which qualifies the county for the return of all fines collected for alcohol and other drug-related traffic offenses occurring in its jurisdiction.

All 62 counties have opted to participate. Each county appoints a STOP-DWI Coordinator, whose duties include the development of a program and the coordination of efforts by agencies involved in alcohol and highway safety.

Summer 2010 75 hrs, \$3,675.00

75 hours were used to make 12 patrol shifts. Officers made (57) traffic stops, (7) DWI arrests, (12) 1192 tickets were written, (3) suspended license arrests were made and (62) other violations were issued.

Fall 2010 70 hrs, \$3,387.00

70 hours were used to make 10 patrol shifts. Officers made (44) traffic stops, (7) DWI arrests, (10) 1192 tickets were written, (1) suspended license arrests were made and (39) other violations were issued.

Spring 2011 70 hrs, \$3,452.00

70 hours were used to make 11 patrol shifts. Officers made (61) traffic stops, (4) DWI arrests, (7) 1192 tickets were written, (1) suspended license arrests were made and (53) other violations were issued.

Summer 2011 70 hrs, \$3,287.00

65 hours were used to make 11 patrol shifts. Officers made (75) traffic stops, (3) DWI arrests, (6) 1192 tickets were written, (3) suspended license arrests were made and (68) other violations were issued.

Fall 2011 60 hrs, \$2,828.00

65 hours were used to make 9 patrol shifts. Officers made (53) traffic stops, (1) DWI arrests, (2) 1192 tickets were written, (2) suspended license arrests were made and (35) other violations were issued.

Spring 2012 70 hrs, \$3,465.00

70 hours were used to make 12 patrol shifts. Officers made (67) traffic stops, (3) DWI arrests, (4) 1192 tickets were written, (1) suspended license arrests were made and (43) other violations were issued.

Summer 2012 75 hrs, \$3,522.00

75 hours were used to make 11 patrol shifts. Officers made (54) traffic stops, (4) DWI arrests, (8) 1192 tickets were written, (2) suspended license arrests were made and (46) other violations were issued.

Fall 2012 60 hrs, \$2,818.00

60 hours were used to make 9 patrol shifts. Officers made (42) traffic stops, (0) DWI arrests, (0) 1192 tickets were written, (1) suspended license arrests was made and (24) other violations were issued.

Spring 2013 40 hrs, \$1,935.00

40 hours were used to make 7 patrol shifts. Officers made (32) traffic stops, (0) DWI arrests, (0) 1192 tickets were written, (2) suspended license arrests was made and (29) other violations were issued.


