Part One Crime = 25

Part One Crime during the week of August 26th through September 1st showed no change in total Part One crime compared to the previous week. Violent Crime yielded a reduction of 40% compared to last week, driven by reductions in both Robbery(-33%) and Aggravated Assault(-57%). Property Crime, conversely, experienced an increase of 27%. Three of the four Property Crime categories showed increases compared to last week. Commercial Burglary showed no change.

Calls for Service = 602

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 602 total calls for service during the week. This was a 7% reduction compared to the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint." This is frequently an officer initiated activity and efforts were increased during the holiday weekend to increase traffic safety. "Disorderly Person" was a close second.

Weapons related calls showed twelve logged entries for the week. This was a 50% increase over the previous week's totals. "Shots Fired" showed the greatest increase by going from two calls in the previous week to eight during the most recent week.

Written Incident Reports = 99

Arrests = 66

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 66 individuals arrested in the City. This was a reduction of approximately 14% compared to the previous week. Notable arrests included charges for Assault 1st, Robbery 2nd, Rape 1st, and Burglary 3rd. Officers also arrested 19 people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh.
