Part One Crime = 39

Part One Crime during the week of August 12th through August 18th resulted in a 63% increase compared to the previous week. Multiple crime categories experienced increases, including Robbery and Aggravated Assault both of which double from the week before. Larcenies also showed a significant increase due in part to increases in thefts from cars and thefts of car parts. Residential Burglary yielded a reduction and five different individuals were arrested during the week for some type of burglary charge.

Calls for Service = 584

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 584 total calls for service during the week. This was an increase of approximately 8% compared to the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Disorderly Person" and it was responsible for over 10% of all logged entries. Traffic complaints closely followed and Alarms were also high on the calls for service list.

Arrests = 53

While Part One crime increased for the week, so did arrests numbers. Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 53 individuals arrested in the City. This was an increase of 39% compared to the previous week. Notable arrests included charges for Assault 1st and Assault 2nd, Violation of Parole, Burglary 2nd and Burglary 3rd, Criminal Possession of a Weapon 2nd and Reckless Endangerment 1st. Officers also arrested 23 people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh.
