### Part One Crime = 23

Part One crime during the week of April 7th through April 13th yielded a 15% increase compared to the previous week. Violent Crime experienced a 9% reduction due to a decrease in Robbery. Conversely, Property Crime increase by 44% compared to the previous week. This was driven mostly by an increase in Larceny. Despite this week's increase, Larceny volume is much lower than it was in recent weeks due to a rash of thefts from motor vehicles. There was only one theft from a motor vehicle this week which was cleared in an arrest.

### Calls for Service = 618

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 618 total calls for service during the week. This was an increase of approximately 12% over the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint." This was an increase of 35% in volume for this call type compared to the previous week. "Disorderly Person," which includes both adult and juvenile participants, was the next most frequent call type. This call type's volume was fairly close to the same volume as last week.

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 53 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Attempted Assault 1st, Assault 2nd (2), Reckless Endangerment 1st, Criminal Possession of Stolen Property and Criminal Possession of a Hypodermic Instrument. Officers arrested twenty-two people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 42% of the arrests for the week.

### Part One Crime = 25

Part One crime during the week of March 24th through March 30th showed a decrease of 19% over the previous week. Multiple crime subcategories showed reductions or no change compared to the previous week. Violent Crime yielded a reduction of 44% for the week after decreases in Aggravated Assault. Two of the four assaults were domestic in nature. Property Crime showed a reduction of 9% after decreases in both Residential Burglary and Larceny. More than half of the Larcenies for the week were thefts from motor vehicles.

### Calls for Service = 552

### Arrests = 61

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 61 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Menacing 2nd, Strangulation 2nd, Tampering with Physical Evidence, Burglary 2nd, Assault 2nd, Unlawful Fleeing from a Police Officer and Criminal Possession of a Weapon 2nd. Officers arrested twenty-two people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 36% of the arrests for the week.

#### Part One Crime = 31

Part One crime during the week of March 17th through March 23rd experienced a 9% decrease over the previous week. This was due to a reduction for the week in Property Crime (-27%). Both Larceny (-22%) and Auto Theft (-67%) contributed to the overall reduction in Property Crime. Violent Crime, conversely, yielded an increase of 125%. This was due to Aggravated Assaults doubling from the week before. There was one assault that was domestic in nature. All other assaults for the week took place between Thursday and Sunday and all of them occurred on a street level.

### Part One Crime = 34

Part One crime during the week of March 10th through March 16th experienced a 62% increase over the previous week. Violent Crime showed one extra incident while Property Crime increase by 67%. An increase occurred in the Violent Crime of Aggravated Assault (+100%). There were no domestic assaults during this week. Residential Burglary, Larceny and Auto Theft all showed increases as well. Approximately 35% of all Larcenies for the week were thefts from motor vehicles.

### Part One Crime = 19

Part One crime during the week of March 31st through April 6th showed a decrease of 24% over the previous week. This was driven by a substantial reduction in Property Crime (-55%). Conversely, Violent Crime suffered an increase of 100% due to increases in both Robbery and Aggravated Assault. Robbery yielded extensive reductions in the last two month before this sudden increase. The reduction in Property Crime is attributed to a decrease in thefts from motor vehicles after the apprehension and arrest of a prolific larcenist.
