Part One Crime = 14

Part One crime during the week of April 14th through April 20th experienced a 42% decrease compared to the previous week. Violent Crime yielded a 55% reduction due to a decrease in Aggravated Assaults. Despite the reduction in Assaults, two of the three incidents for the week were bullet to body shootings. Firearms related reports and investigations have been consuming a large amount of department resources in the last month. Property Crime showed a reduction of 31% this week. Multiple Property Crime subcategories showed reductions.

Calls for Service = 550

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 550 total calls for service during the week. This was a decrease of approximately 11% over the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint." This was an a decrease of 18% in volume for this call type compared to the previous week. "Disorderly Person," which includes both adult and juvenile participants, was the next most frequent call type. This call type's volume yielded a reduction of 16% compared to last week.

Weapons related calls for service experienced a reduction of 55% over the previous week. "Shooting" was the most frequent entry for the week which resulted in a 300% increase over last week. The other weapon related call types showed reductions.

Written Incident Reports = 79

Arrests = 56

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 56 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Robbery 1st, Robbery 2nd, Burglary 1st, Menacing 2nd, Violation of Parole, Aggravated Driving While Intoxicated and Violation of Probation. Officers arrested twelve people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 21% of the arrests for the week.
