Part One Crime = 15

Part One crime during the week of April 28th through May 4th experienced a 46% decrease compared to the previous week. Violent Crime yielded a 36% decrease during the week after significant reductions in Aggravated Assaults (-63%). Property Crime also saw a decrease for the week of 53%. This was due to reductions in both Residential Burglary (-60%) and Larceny (-58%). There were no Auto Thefts this week.

Calls for Service = 556

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 556 total calls for service during the week. This was nearly the same call volume as the week before. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Disorderly Person." This was an increase of 22% compared to last week and accounted for roughly 16% of all calls for the week. "Traffic Complaint" was the next most frequent call type. This call type's volume yielded a reduction of 28% compared to the previous week.

Weapons related calls for service experienced a 50% reduction over last week. "Gun Call" was the most frequent call type and showed an increase of 67%. "Shots Fired" calls yielded a decreased of 83% for the week. "Weapons Violation" and "Shooting" showed no change compared to

last week.

Arrests = 61

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 61 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Assault 2nd, Menacing 2nd, Robbery 3rd, Attempted Robbery 3rd and Violation of Parole. Officers arrested 31 people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 31% of the arrests for the week.

Part One Crime = 27

Part One crime during the week of May 5th through May 11th yielded an 80% increase compared to the previous week. Violent Crime and Property Crime both increased by the same number of incidents (+6). This resulted in an 86% increase in Violent Crime and a 75% increase in Property Crime for the week. Violent Crime increases were driven by a 200% increase in Aggravated Assaults. This included three domestic assaults. Property Crime saw the greatest increase in Larcenies for the week. This was due to a sudden surge in thefts from motor vehicles (five incidents).

Calls for Service = 576

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 576 total calls for service during the week. This is an increase of 4% over the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Disorderly Person." This was nearly the same volume as last week and accounted for approximately 15% of all calls for the week. "Traffic Complaint" was the next most frequent call type. This call type's volume experienced an increase of 46% compared to the previous week.

Weapons related calls for service experienced a 12.5% reduction over last week. "Gun Call" was the most frequent call type, but yielded a 40% reduction. "Shots Fired" calls remained the same while "Shooting" calls increased. "Weapons Violation" decreased this week.

Written Incident Reports = 103

Arrests = 50

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 50 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Criminal Possession of a Weapon 2nd, Criminal Possession of a Firearm, Attempted Robbery 3rd, Reckless Endangerment and Menacing 2nd. Officers arrested 21 people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 42% of the arrests for the week.
