Part One Crime = 23

Part One crime during the week of January 12th through January 18th, 2015 yielded an increase of 53% compared to the previous week. Violent Crime had a decrease of 43% after a reductions in both Aggravated Assault (-25%) and Robbery (-67%). There were no bullet to body shootings during the reporting period. Two of the assaults were domestic in nature and both have been closed in arrest. Property Crime experienced a significant increase of 138%. Burglary was particularly problematic this week, but multiple arrests have already been made. Detectives believe one of the burglary arrestees is responsible for several Commercial Burglaries and are currently gathering additional evidence for further charges. All subjects arrested for Burglary this week showed previous criminal charges. Auto Theft showed all cars were running and left unattended at the time they were stolen.

Calls for Service = 538

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 538 total calls for service during the week. This was an increase of 8.5% over the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint." This call type accounted for 18% of the week's activity and is usually an officer initiated vehicle stop. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type. This call type increase by 35% this week compared to last week. It also accounted for 10% of all call volume for the week.

Weapon related calls for service increased by 100% this week compared to last week, but the actual number of calls was extremely low. This week in 2014 showed ten weapon related calls for service. The Department has continued its efforts to target street level activity that leads to gun violence and this has assisted in the reduction of these call types.

Arrests = 52

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 52 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Violation of Parole, Menacing 2nd, Assault 2nd, Unlawful Possession of a Weapon on School Grounds (BB Gun), Criminal Possession of Stolen Property, Robbery 1st, Gang Assault 1st and Burglary 2nd. Officers arrested seventeen people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 33% of the arrests for the week.
