### Part One Crime = 32

Part One crime during the week of November 2nd through November 8th showed an increase in total Part One crime levels compared to the previous week. Violent Crime increased by one additional incident for the week after Robbery increased by one. Aggravated Assaults showed no change compared to the previous week. There were four domestic assaults during the week. There were no gun related Assaults this week. Property Crime experienced an increase this week compared to the previous week. Residential Burglary and Larceny both yielded an increase for the week. This week's Larcenies showed multiple thefts from buildings with one location targeted twice.

### Calls for Service = 618

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 618 total calls for service during the week. This was a decrease of nearly 9% compared to the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Disorderly Person" with 13% of the call activity for the week. This call type increased by 9.5% compared to the previous week. "Traffic Complaint" was the next most frequent call type with 11% of entries. This call type decreased by 39% this week compared to the previous week.

### Written Incident Reports = 161

### Arrests = 65

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 65 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Reckless Endangerment 1st, Obstruction of Governmental Administration, Reckless Driving, Menacing 2nd, Unlawful Fleeing a Police Officer in a Motor Vehicle, Assault 2nd, Endangering the Welfare of a Child, Patronizing a Prostitute (multiple subjects), Criminal Possession of a Weapon 4th, Prostitution (multiple subjects) and Criminal Contempt 2nd. Officers arrested eighteen people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 28% of the arrests for the week.
