Part One crime during the week of December 7th through December 13th showed an increase in total Part One crime numbers compared to the previous week. Violent Crime figures showed no change in any subcategory. There was one domestic Aggravated Assaults during the week. There were also no gun related Assaults during the week. There were three gunpoint Robberies this week, but no bullet to body shootings. Property Crime experienced an increase for the week compared to the previous week. Both Residential Burglary and Larceny showed increases. There were several thefts from cars during the reporting period.

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 530 total calls for service during the week. This was a increase of 15.5% compared to the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint" with 9% of the call activity for the week. This call type increased by approximately 47% this week compared to the previous week. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type also with 9% of entries. This call type increased by approximately 2% this week compared to the previous week.

Written Incident Reports = 96

Arrests = 46

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 46 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Criminal Possession of a Forged Instrument 2nd, Criminal Mischief 4th, Violation of Probation, Petit Larceny, Criminal Trespass 3rd, Violation of Parole, Assault 2nd, Criminal Possession of Stolen Property 5th, Endangering the Welfare of a Child, Burglary 2nd, Criminal Contempt 2nd and Driving While Intoxicated. Officers arrested eleven people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 24% of the arrests for the week.
