### Part One Crime = 24

Part One crime during the week of February 16th through February 22nd, 2015 yielded a significant increase compared to the previous week. This is due in part to very low numbers in the previous week. Violent Crime had two additional incidents for the week. There were two domestic assaults with one incident already closed in arrest. There were no bullet to body shootings this week. Robbery experienced a reduction. Property Crime drove the overall Part One crime increase due to a significant increase in Larcenies. While Larceny numbers were very high for the week, Larceny levels so far this month are down 31%. The week's activity shows several thefts from building (different buildings) and a few theft from motor vehicle incidents. Residential Burglary also increased this week with two incidents involving theft of copper and/or scrap metal.

### Calls for Service = 558

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 558 total calls for service during the week. This was a slight increase of 2% over the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint" with 15% of the call activity for the week. This was a 15% increase in volume for this entry type. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type with 8% of entries.

Weapon related calls for service increased significantly during the reporting period. The most frequent call type was "Gun Call," which doubled in volume compared to the previous week. "Shooting" and "Shots Fired" calls also increased during the week compared to the previous week.

### Written Incident Reports = 65

### Arrests = 36

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 36 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Aggravated Driving While Intoxicated, Harassment 2nd, Assault 2nd (more than one arrest), Criminal Possession of Stolen Property, Criminal Possession of a Weapon, Criminal Contempt 1st and Grand Larceny. Officers arrested twelve people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 33% of the arrests for the week.
