Part One Crime = 6

Part One crime during the week of February 23rd through March 1st, 2015 ended with a significant decrease compared to the previous week. The week of the 15th through the 21st showed the highest volume in activity for the month of February. Reductions in the week's activity occurred in multiple categories causing an exponential decrease in total crime levels. Violent Crime experienced a 60% reduction for the week. The single assault for the week was domestic in nature. There were no bullet to body shootings this week or during the entire month of February. Property Crime yielded a lofty reduction of 80% for the week with decreases in three of the four subcategories. The most notable reduction occurred in Larcenies with an 83% decrease for the week. This was due to a decrease in theft from motor vehicles compared to the previous week.

Calls for Service = 588

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 588 total calls for service during the week. This was an increase of 5% over the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint" with 21% of the call activity for the week. This was a 48% increase in volume for this entry type. This call type is also often officer initiated. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type with 8% of entries. This was the same level of activity as last week for this call type.

Weapon related calls for service decreased significantly during the reporting period. The only call type was "Gun Call," which yielded a reduction of 50% compared to last week. "Shooting" and "Shots Fired" also showed decreases compared to the previous week's levels.

Arrests = 43

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 43 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Violation of Parole, Burglary 2nd, Petit Larceny, Violation of Probation, Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance, Obstruction of Breathing or Blood Circulation, Criminal Possession of a Weapon 4th and Menacing 2nd. Officers arrested eleven people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 26% of the arrests for the week.
