Part One Crime = 15

Part One crime during the week of February 2nd through February 8th, 2015 experienced a 29% reduction compared to the previous week. Violent Crime increased due to increases in Aggravated Assault. There were two assaults that were domestic in nature with one cleared by arrest. There were no bullet to body shootings during the reporting period. Robbery experienced a decrease of 60% after high numbers the previous week. One Robbery has already been cleared by arrest. Property Crime yielded a significant decrease of 60% compared to the last week. This reduction was driven by a second week in a row of decreases in Larceny.

Calls for Service = 584

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 584 total calls for service during the week. This was a reduction of nearly 10% over the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Snow Towing" again after the City declared a snow emergency. This was a reduction of 27% compared to the week before. Snow Tows accounted for 15% of the week's activity. "Traffic Complaint" was the next most frequent call type. It accounted for 12% of all call volume for the week.

Weapon related calls for service showed a 57% reduction this week compared to last week. The most frequent call type was "Gun Call," which experienced a notable decrease of 60% compared to the previous week. All other call types remained at the same level as last week.

Arrests = 28

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 28 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Grand Larceny, Obstructing Governmental Administration, Criminal Contempt, Attempted Robbery 2nd and Harassment. Officers arrested eleven people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 39% of the arrests for the week.
