Part One Crime = 30

Part One crime during the week of March 21st through March 27th yielded a notable increase compared to the previous week. Violent Crime experienced a significant increase. The City had its first homicide of the year which is currently under investigation. There was an increase in Robbery that included four gunpoint Robberies. One gunpoint Robbery resulted in a bullet to body shooting. There were three Assaults that were domestic in nature and all of them have been closed in arrest. There were two gun related Assaults for the week, but neither of them were bullet to body shootings. Property Crime also experienced an increase this week compared to the previous week. Commercial Burglary and Larceny both experienced increases. There were three thefts from unlocked motor vehicles during the week.

City of Newburgh Police did not administer Narcan during the reporting period.

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 578 total calls for service during the week. This was a increase of 15% compared to the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint" with 14% of the call activity for the week. This was an increase of 32% compared to the previous week. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type with 13% of entries. This call type experienced an increase of 41% compared to the previous week.

Arrests = 50

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 50 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Petit Larceny, Harassment 2nd, Assault 3rd, Menacing 2nd, Criminal Possession of a Weapon 4th, Violation of Parole, Probation Warrant, Assault 2nd, Reckless Driving, Resisting Arrest, Obstruction of Governmental Administration 2nd and Unlawful Fleeing a Police Officer in a Motor Vehicle. Officers arrested twelve people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 24% of the arrests for the week.
