## Part One Crime = 19

Part One crime during the week of March 28th through April 3rd yielded a reduction compared to the previous week. The previous week showed the highest crime levels for the month of March. Violent Crime showed a decrease this week after reduction in all subcategories. There were no Assaults that were domestic in nature. There were four gun related Assaults for the week with two being an actual bullet to body shootings. Two of these incidents have already been closed in arrest. Other assault cases have been closed in arrest as well. Property Crime also experienced a decrease this week compared to the previous week. Three of the four Property Crime subcategories experienced reductions this week compared to last week.

## Calls for Service = 542

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 542 total calls for service during the week. This was a decrease of about 6% compared to the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Disorderly Person" with 13% of the call activity for the week. This was a decrease of 5% compared to the previous week. "Traffic Complaint" was the next most frequent call type with 9% of entries. This call type experienced a 39% reduction in volume compared to the previous week.

## Arrests = 53

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 53 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Attempted Murder 2nd, Violation of Parole, Assault 2nd, Obstructing Governmental Administration, Petit Larceny, Criminal Contempt 2nd, Criminal Possession of a Firearm 2nd, Assault 1st, Robbery 1st, Endangering the Welfare of a Child, Robbery 2nd and Falsely Reporting an Incident 2nd. Officers arrested fifteen people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 28% of the arrests for the week.
