Part One Crime = 24

Part One crime during the week of March 30th through April 5th, 2015 experienced an increase of 26% compared to the previous week. Violent Crime showed no change for the week. There was one homicide which has been cleared by an arrest. Robbery has yielded a decrease with no reported incidents in the last week. Aggravated Assaults showed one extra incident for the week. There were two assaults that were domestic in nature and no bullet to body shootings. Property Crime experienced an increase of 42% for the week. This was driven predominately by an increase in Larceny. There was a high number of reported thefts from buildings.

Preliminary Part One crime figures for March 2015 revealed an overall reduction of 31% compared to March 2014. Violent Crime experienced an increase of 21% due to an increase in Robberies. March 2014 had abnormally low Robbery levels. Despite the increase, March 2015 Robbery figures were still below a five year average and within a normal range. Property Crime yielded a 43% reduction in March 2015. There was an increase in Residential Burglary, but reductions in Larceny and Auto Theft brought the overall Property Crime volume down.

Calls for Service = 632

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 632 total calls for service during the week. This was a decrease of nearly 13% over the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint" with 19% of the call activity for the week. This entry is frequently officer initiated activity. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type with 12% of entries. March calls for service data showed an increase of 20% compared to March 2014. This included an increase of 9% in public generated entries (911, walk in complaints, etc.) and a 45% increase in officer initiated activity.

Weapon related calls for service yielded a reduction of 50% this week compared to last week. "Shooting" calls showed a significant reduction (-100%) this week along with a decrease in "Gun Calls" (-25%). March gun related calls for service yielded a 23.5% reduction compared to March 2014. The most notable reduction was in "Shots Fired" entries with a reduction of

approximately 44%.

Arrests = 56

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 56 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Unlawful Imprisonment 2nd, Grand Larceny 3rd, Assault 2nd, Burglary 1st, Criminal Possession of a Weapon 4th, Sex Offender Failure to Register, Attempted Assault 2nd, Burglary 2nd, and Criminal Possession of a Firearm. Officers arrested seventeen people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 30% of the arrests for the week.
