Part One Crime = 26

Part One crime during the week of April 13th through April 19th, 2015 experienced an increase compared to the previous week. Multiple subcategories experienced increases resulting in both Violent Crime and Property Crime showing increased volume. Violent Crime experienced an increase after a significant increase in Aggravated Assaults. This included two incidents that were domestic in nature. There was also one assault that involved a firearm. Property Crime also increased this week, especially Larcenies. Officers took reports on several Larceny types including thefts from buildings, theft from motor vehicles, bicycle thefts and shoplifting. Despite the current weekly increase, the City is still experiencing a year to date reduction in total Part One crime.

Calls for Service = 746

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 746 total calls for service during the week. This was an increase of nearly 6% over the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint" with 21% of the call activity for the week. This was about the same volume as the previous week. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type with 12% of entries. This call type was also a similar level to the week before.

Arrests = 40

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 40 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Criminal Possession of a Weapon 4th, Violation of Parole, Menacing 2nd, Assault 2nd, Handling and Disposal of Residential Waste (City Code), Rape 1st, Petit Larceny, Grand Larceny and Rape 3rd. Officers arrested fourteen people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 35% of the arrests for the week.
