Part One Crime = 19

Part One crime during the week of April 27th through May 3rd, 2015 experienced an increase of 19% compared to the previous week. While several subcategories showed no change in crime volume, a few showed an extra one or two incidents that resulted in an overall increase. Violent Crime yielded an increase for the week after increases in both Rape and Aggravated Assault. Assaults included one incident that was domestic in nature which has already been cleared in arrest. There were no shootings this week. Property Crime showed an increase of one incident for the week due to an increase in Residential Burglaries.

Preliminary Part One crime figures for the month of April 2015 showed an increase of 1% compared to April 2014. Violent Crime yielded a reduction of 46% after significant reductions in both Robbery (-67%) and Aggravated Assault (-43%). Conversely, Property Crime experienced an increase of 39% due to increases in both Residential Burglary (30%) and Larceny (41%). Community members are reminded that they should report any suspicious activity around cars, buildings, construction sites and other areas to assist in reducing Property Crimes. Year to date total Part One crime, Violent Crime and Property Crime are all showing reductions.

Calls for Service = 702

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 702 total calls for service during the week. This was a increase of 6% over the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint" with 14% of the call activity for the week. This was reduction of 36% over the previous week. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type with 12% of entries. This call type experienced an increase of 7.5% over the previous week. Calls for service entries in April 2015 increased by 21% after an increase in public generated calls of 8% and an increase in officer initiated activity of 50%.

Arrests = 57

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 57 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Criminal Possession of a Weapon 2nd, Menacing 2nd, Criminal Contempt 2nd, Fugitive from Justice, Forcible Touching, Unlawfully Possessing Noxious Material, Reckless Endangerment 1st, Burglary 1st, Assault 2nd and Criminal Possession of a Firearm. Officers arrested twenty-four people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 42% of the arrests for the week.
