## Part One Crime = 17

Part One crime during the week of April 6th through April 12th, 2015 yielded a decrease of 35% compared to the previous week. Violent Crime experienced a decrease this week driven by a significant reduction in Aggravated Assaults. The single assault for the week was neither domestic, nor was it gun related. Property Crime also experienced a decrease for the week (-26%). Three of the four Property Crime subcategories showed reductions for the week. City of Newburgh Police have seen a recent increase in both thefts from cars and also thefts from people's yards. The Department reminds everyone not to leave valuables inside vehicles and to keep items like ladders and other tools secured when not in use.

## Calls for Service = 707

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 707 total calls for service during the week. This was an increase of nearly 12% over the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint" with 22% of the call activity for the week. This entry increased by 34% over the previous week. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type with 12% of entries. This call types also sustained an increase this week.

Weapon related calls for service showed no change in total volume this week compared to last week. "Gun Calls" decreased by 33%, while "Shooting" and "Shots Fired" calls remained unchanged. "Weapons Violation" calls increased. The City of Newburgh Police Department is still actively deploying

GIVE program resources to areas of the City showing an

increase in gun violence. These efforts have resulted in the reduction of gun related calls for service, as well as firearm crimes.

## Written Incident Reports = 89

## Arrests = 53

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 53 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Murder 2nd, Criminal Possession of Stolen Property, Violation of Probation, Petit Larceny, Burglary 3rd and Rape 3rd. Officers arrested twenty-two people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 42% of the arrests for the week.
