Part One Crime = 22

Part One crime during the week of May 18th through May 24th, 2015 yielded a slight decrease compared to the previous week. Violent Crime experienced an increase this week after one additional incident. Robbery showed a decreased, while Rape showed an increase. Both Rapes are currently under investigation. Aggravated Assaults showed no changed compared to last week, but there was a large spike in activity on May 24th after multiple people were injured in one incident. There were no domestic assaults. There were two gun related assaults with one shooting. Total Property Crime levels experienced a reduction this week. This was due to a decrease in Larcenies.

Calls for Service = 673

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 673 total calls for service during the week. This was a decrease of 9% compared to the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Disorderly Person" with 16% of the call activity for the week. This call type includes both adults and juveniles. This was similar to levels from the previous week. "Traffic Complaint" was the next most frequent call type with 13% of entries. This call type experienced a 26% reduction over the previous week.

Arrests = 47

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 47 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Menacing 2nd, Assault 2nd, Obstruction of Governmental Administration 2nd, Burglary 2nd, Robbery 1st, Robbery 2nd (multiple arrested subjects), Criminal Contempt 2nd and Criminal Possession of a Weapon 2nd. Officers arrested nineteen people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 40% of the arrests for the week.
