### Part One Crime = 30

Part One crime during the week of May 30th through June 5th showed no total change compared to the previous week. Violent Crime experienced an increase. There were two strong-arm Robberies and one gunpoint Robbery that was closed in arrest. There were no Aggravated Assaults that were domestic in nature this week. There were two gun related Assaults, including one shooting. At least two assault incidents show the involvement of alcohol. Property Crime showed a reduction this week compared to the previous week. Both Residential Burglaries and Larcenies experienced decreases, while Auto Theft yielded an increase.

### Calls for Service = 634

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 634 total calls for service during the week. This was a decrease of about 3% compared to the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Disorderly Person" with 11% of the call activity for the week. This was an increase of 19% over the previous week. "Traffic Complaint" was the next most frequent call type with 9% of entries. This call type experienced a 24% decrease in call volume compared to the previous week.

### Written Incident Reports = 124

### Arrests = 43

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 43 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges Criminal Contempt 2nd, Harassment 2nd, Probation Warrant, Criminal Possession of a Weapon 2nd, Exposure of a Person, Menacing 2nd, Criminal Possession of a Weapon 3rd, Forgery 3rd, Driving While Intoxicated and Theft of Services. Officers arrested twelve people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 28% of the arrests for the week.
