### Part One Crime = 35

Part One crime during the week of June 20th through June 26th experienced an increase compared to the previous week. Violent Crime increased after an increase in Robbery. Robberies showed two domestic related Robberies, which is unusual. Two other Robberies showed incidents between subjects who knew each other. Aggravated Assaults experienced a decrease. There were no Aggravated Assaults that were domestic in nature this week. There were no gun related Assaults. Property Crime showed a decrease this week compared to the previous week. Larcenies showed a slight increase. The City has been experiencing an increase in thefts from cars and thefts of car parts.

### Calls for Service = 607

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 607 total calls for service during the week. This was a decrease of 4% compared to the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Disorderly Person" with 14% of the call activity for the week. This was an increase of 26% over the previous week. "Alarm" was the next most frequent call type with 6% of entries. This was the same call volume as the previous week.

### Arrests = 55

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 55 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges Criminal Mischief 4th, Obstruction of Governmental Administration 2nd, Harassment 2nd, Criminal Possession of Stolen Property 5th, Attempted Rape 1st, Petit Larceny, Robbery 2nd, Reckless Driving, Grand Larceny, Attempted Burglary 2nd, Reckless Endangerment 2nd, Violation of Parole, Assault 2nd, Fugitive from Justice, Burglary 2nd, Criminal Contempt 2nd and Identity Theft 2nd. Officers arrested twelve people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 22% of the arrests for the week.
