### Part One Crime = 35

Part One crime during the week of June 29th through July 5th, 2015 experienced a significant increase compared to the previous week. Violent Crime yielded an increase of three additional incidents. Both Robbery and Aggravated Assault saw increases for the week. There were no domestic assaults, but two gun related incidents. This included one bullet to body shooting. There was also one gunpoint Robbery with no injury. The City saw spikes in Violent Crime on the 4th and 5th of July with little to no Violent Crime activity the rest of the week. Property Crime also showed an increase this week compared to the previous week. Larceny increases were particularly high with reports showing a range of Larceny types occurring throughout the week.

### Calls for Service = 635

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 635 total calls for service during the week. This was a decrease of nearly 4% compared to the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Disorderly Person" with 14% of the call activity for the week. This was an increase of 19% over last week's volume for this call entry. "Traffic Complaint" was the next most frequent call type with 11% of entries. This call type showed a 29% reduction over the previous week.

### Arrests = 56

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 56 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Robbery 3rd, Criminal Contempt 1st, Patronizing a Prostitute, Prostitution, Criminal Possession of Stolen Property 5th, Obstructing Governmental Administration 2nd, Rape 2nd, Petit Larceny and Criminal Impersonation 2nd. Officers arrested fifteen people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 27% of the arrests for the week.
