Part One Crime = 20

Part One crime during the week of June 8th through June 14th, 2015 showed an increase compared to the previous week. Violent Crime experienced a decrease of one less incident after a reduction in Aggravated Assault. There were no domestic assaults or gun related assaults for the week. Property Crime reports increased this week compared to the previous week. Three of the four Property Crime subcategories experienced increases. Larcenies showed at least one domestic incident for the week. Thefts from cars is also continuing to be problematic for the city. Residential Burglaries showed no change between weeks.

Calls for Service = 733

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 733 total calls for service during the week. This was an increase of nearly 10% compared to the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint" with 20% of the call activity for the week. This call type is frequently officer initiated activity. This was about a 46.5% increase over the last week. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type with 14% of entries. This call type showed a 13% reduction over the previous week.

Arrests = 62

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 62 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Burglary 3rd, Menacing 2nd, Harassment 2nd, Criminal Mischief 3rd, Unauthorized Use of a Vehicle 2nd, Violation of Probation and Endangering the Welfare of a Child. There were also multiple arrests on Bench warrants. Officers arrested seventeen people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 27% of the arrests for the week.
