Part One Crime = 27

Part One crime during the week of July 13th through July 19th, 2015 yielded an increase compared to the previous week. This was due to an increase in Violent Crime compared to the previous week. Aggravated Assault showed one additional incident for the week. There were two domestic assaults including one arrest. There was also one bullet to body shooting during the week. Property Crime showed no change this week compared to the previous week. Burglaries both showed reductions this week while Larceny increased. There have been several Commercial Burglaries so far this month. Anyone with a burglar alarm that is monitored by a company, be it a residential or commercial property, is reminded to have those companies alert police first so that the response time is reduced.

City of Newburgh Police did not administer Narcan during the reporting period.

Calls for Service = 804

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 804 total calls for service during the week. This was an increase of approximately 15% compared to the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Compliant" with 14% of the call activity for the week. This was an increase of 17.5% over last week's volume for this call entry. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type, also with 14% of entries. This call type showed a 5% increase over the previous week.

Arrests = 64

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 64 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Burglary 2nd, Assault 2nd, Obstruction of Breathing, Criminal Impersonation 2nd, Criminal Mischief 4th, Harassment 2nd, Violation of Parole, Arson 4th and Burglary 3rd. Officers arrested twenty people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 31% of the arrests for the week.
