## Part One Crime = 21

Part One crime during the week of August 1st through August 7th revealed a decrease compared to the previous week. Violent Crime saw a reduction despite the addition of a Homicide and a Rape. The Homicide involved a firearm and is currently under investigation. There were no Aggravated Assault that were domestic in nature this week. There was one gun related Assault this week, which resulted in a bullet to body shootings. Property Crime yielded an reduction this week compared to the previous week. While both Burglary subcategories remained unchanged, but Larcenies showed a slight reduction.

## Calls for Service = 573

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 573 total calls for service during the week. This was a decrease of 4% compared to the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Disorderly Person" with 9% of the call activity for the week. This was a decrease of 10% over the previous week. "Alarm" was the next most frequent call type with 8% of entries. This was a reduction of about 13% compared to the previous week.

Weapon related calls for service increase slightly this week compared to the previous week. While "Gun Call" entries showed a reduction this week compared to the previous week, "Shooting" and "Shots Fired" entries yielded increases.

## Written Incident Reports = 105

## Arrests = 37

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 37 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Reckless Driving, Endangering the Welfare of a Child, Criminal Contempt 2nd, Resisting Arrest, Menacing 2nd, Driving While Intoxicated, Violation of Parole, Petit Larceny, Obstruction of Breathing, Assault 3rd and Obstruction of Governmental Administration. Officers arrested twelve people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 32% of the arrests for the week.
