## Part One Crime = 24

Part One crime during the week of August 22nd through August 28th showed a decrease compared to the previous week. Total Violent Crime volume experienced no change. There were two Aggravated Assaults that were domestic in nature this week and one has been closed in arrest. There were two gun related Assaults this week with one resulting in a bullet to body shooting. Property Crime yielded a decrease this week compared to the previous week. Both burglary subcategories experienced increases, but the reduction in Larceny was enough to bring down the total Property Crime figures for the week.

## Calls for Service = 603

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 603 total calls for service during the week. This was a decrease of 3.5% compared to the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint" with 12% of the call activity for the week. This was a decrease of 24% over the previous week. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type with 11% of entries. This call type showed a reduction of nearly 6% this week compared to last week.

## Written Incident Reports = 97

## Arrests = 39

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 39 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Endangering the Welfare of a Child, Reckless Driving, Harassment 2nd, Grand Larceny 4th, Criminal Contempt 2nd, Petit Larceny, Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance 3rd, Burglary 3rd, Criminal Mischief 2nd and Forgery 2nd. Officers arrested eighteen people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 46% of the arrests for the week.
