Part One Crime = 21

Part One crime during the week of September 1st through September 7th experienced a 9% decrease compared to the previous week. Total Violent Crime figures remained stable, but Robbery yielded an increase (+100%). Conversely, Aggravated Assaults decreased by 40% for the week. This included one domestic assault and one Bullet to Body Shooting. Property Crime saw a reduction of 13% compared to last week. Residential Burglary was the only Property Crime to experience an increase (+20%).

Calls for Service = 601

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 601 total calls for service during the week. This was an approximate decrease of 6% over the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Disorderly Person," which showed a slight decrease over last week. This call type accounted for 16% of the week's activity. "Traffic Complaint" was the next most frequent call type. This call type decreased by roughly 11% for the week.

This week yielded a reduction of 42% in total weapons related calls for service volume. "Gun Call" was the most frequent call type, but declined 33% this week compared to last week. "Shots Fired" showed the greatest decrease after a reduction of 80% compared to last week.

Written Incident Reports = 118

Arrests = 49

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 49 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Exposure of a Person, Menacing 2nd, Unlawful Fleeing a Police Officer in a Motor Vehicle, Strangulation 2nd, Attempted Rape 3rd, Assault 2nd and Criminal Possession of a Weapon 2nd. Officers arrested eight people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 16% of the arrests for the week.
