Part One Crime = 20

Part One crime during the week of December 8 through December 14, 2014 experienced no change compared to the previous week. Violent Crime had an increase of 14% after one additional incident. Robbery yielded a 50% reduction, but Aggravated Assault increased by 100%. There were no gun related Aggravated Assaults this week. Property Crime decreased by 8% compared to last week with the reduction of one incident. Both Residential Burglary (-33%) and Larceny (-13%) showed a decrease.

Calls for Service = 429

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 429 total calls for service during the week. This was a reduction of 7% over the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint." This call type accounted for 12% of the week's activity. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type. This call type decreased by 19% over last week.

Weapon related calls for service decreased by approximately 43% compared to the previous week. "Gun Call" was the most frequent call type and showed an increase of 100% compared to the previous week. "Shots Fired" showed a significant decrease of 67% compared to last week. "Shooting" calls also showed a reduction.

Arrests = 29

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 29 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Forcible Touching, Obstruction of Breathing, Attempted Robbery 1st, Tampering with Physical Evidence, Violation of Probation, Criminal Possession of Stolen Property, Burglary 2nd, Unlawful Imprisonment 2nd, and Robbery 3rd. Officers arrested seven people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 24% of the arrests for the week.
