Chairman Allen opened the meeting by welcoming the members and the public.

A motion to enter executive session was made by George Keller and seconded by Ramona Monteverde. After review and deliberation of Complaint No. IAD 3-2015 and the Chief's investigation, the Board unanimously issued a finding of exonerated.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Ramona Monteverde and seconded by Rasheda Worth. The motion was approved unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 8:25 pm.
