Part One Crime = 23

Part One crime during the week of October 19th through October 25th, 2015 showed no change in total Part One crime levels compared to the previous week. Violent Crime yielded an increase for the week. Robbery showed a decrease compared to the previous week by showing no incidents. Aggravated Assaults increased by two additional incidents compared to the previous week. There were four domestic assaults during the week. There were two gun related Assaults, but no bullet to body shootings. Property Crime experienced a decrease this week compared to the previous week. Officers are still responding to numerous reports of thefts either from the inside of motor vehicles or of motor vehicles parts.

City of Newburgh Police did not administer Narcan during the reporting period.

Calls for Service = 638

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 638 total calls for service during the week. This was an increase of nearly 5% compared to the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint" with 13% of the call activity for the week. This call type increased by 12% compared to the previous week. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type with 11% of entries. This call type increased by approximately 21% this week compared to the previous week.

Arrests = 56

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 56 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Criminal Possession of a Weapon 2nd (3 separate arrests of different individuals), Violation of Parole, Reckless Endangerment 1st, Resisting Arrest, Menacing 2nd, Assault 2nd (multiple separate arrests of different individuals), Criminal Contempt 2nd, Exposure of a Person, Petit Larceny, Robbery 3rd and Aggravated Sexual Abuse 2nd. Officers arrested seventeen people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 30% of the arrests for the week.
