Part One Crime = 11

Part One crime during the week of March 2nd through March 8th, 2015 yielded an increase compared to the previous week. This increase was driven predominantly by an increase in Violent Crime. There were no domestic assaults during the week. There was one bullet to body shooting during the course of a Robbery. A gun was recovered on scene. This was the first bullet to body shooting of 2015. There were seven bullet to body shootings by the end of February 2014. Property Crime showed no change in volume for the week, although the first week of the March this year has shown a reduction compared to the same week in 2014.

Calls for Service = 540

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 540 total calls for service during the week. This was a decrease of 8% over the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint" with 12% of the call activity for the week. This was a significant decrease in volume for this entry type. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type with 8% of entries. This call level was slightly lower than last week .

Weapon related calls for service remained the same during the reporting period. "Gun Call" yielded a reduction of 50% compared to last week. "Shooting" calls increased compared to the previous week. The Department has continued to deploy officers to gun related hotspots in the city in an effort to reduce these call types along with gun

related incidents.

Arrests = 53

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 53 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Criminal Possession of a Weapon 2nd, Violations of Parole, Aggravated Driving While Intoxicated, Forgery 2nd, Criminal Impersonation 1st, Reckless Endangerment 1st and Criminal Possession of a Firearm. Officers arrested twenty-one people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 40% of the arrests for the week.
