Part One Crime = 29

Part One crime during the week of May 23rd through May 29th experienced a decrease compared to the previous week. Violent Crime yielded a reduction after decreases in both Robbery and Aggravated Assault. There were two strong-arm Robberies with one closed in the arrest of a juvenile. The other Robbery was domestic in nature. There was also one Aggravated Assault that was domestic in nature this week. There was one gun related Assault and it has been closed in arrest. Property Crime showed no total change this week compared to the previous week. There was increase in Residential Burglaries that was offset by decreases in both Commercial Burglary and Larceny. Residential Burglaries showed one domestic incident and another showed theft of copper pipes.

City of Newburgh Police did not administered Narcan during the reporting period.

Calls for Service = 651

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 651 total calls for service during the week. This was a decrease of 2% compared to the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint" with 12% of the call activity for the week. This was a decrease of 14% over the previous week. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type with 9% of entries. This call type experienced a 13% decrease in call volume compared to the previous week.

Weapon related calls for service experienced a notable reduction after high numbers the week before. Reductions occurred in both "Shooting" and "Shots Fired" entries, while the other two call types remained unchanged for the week.

Written Incident Reports = 125

Arrests = 67

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 67 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges Menacing 2nd, Obstructing Governmental Administration, Resisting Arrest, Robbery 3rd, Petit Larceny, Assault 2nd, Grand Larceny 4th, Sex Trafficking, Criminal Mischief 4th, Assaults 1st, Obstruction of Breathing, Endangering the Welfare of a Child and Fugitive from Justice. Officers arrested twenty-seven people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 40% of the arrests for the week.
