Part One Crime = 34

Part One crime during the week of August 3rd through August 9th, 2015 showed an increase of four additional crimes compared to the previous week. Violent Crime experienced an increase for the week. This was driven most notably by an increase in Aggravated Assaults. There was one domestic assault during the reporting period. There were two gun related assaults during the week with no bullet to body shootings. Property Crime experienced a slight decrease this week compared to the previous week. Larceny levels continue to remain high, but thefts from motor vehicles are not as prevalent as previous weeks.

City of Newburgh Police did not administered Narcan during the reporting period.

Calls for Service = 778

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 778 total calls for service during the week. This was an increase of 5.4% compared to the previous week. This is also the second week in a row of increases. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Compliant" with 14% of the call activity for the week. This was a decrease of about 7% over last week's volume for this call entry. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type with 11% of entries. This call type showed a 3% reduction compared to the previous week.

Arrests = 55

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 55 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Reckless Driving, Criminal Contempt, Leaving the Scene of an Auto Accident with Injury, Robbery 1st, Resisting Arrest, Violation of Parole, Littering, Criminal Possession of a Weapon 2nd, Gang Assault 1st, Burglary 2nd, Tampering with Physical Evidence, Grand Larceny 4th, Menacing 2nd, Robbery 2nd and Robbery 3rd. Officers arrested sixteen people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 29% of the arrests for the week.
