Part One Crime = 21

Part One crime during the week of September 7th through September 13th, 2015 yielded a minor decrease compared to the previous week. Violent Crime experienced a reduction with three of the four subcategories yielding decreases. There were no domestic assaults or bullet to body shootings this week. There was one attempted gunpoint Robbery with no injury which has been cleared in arrest. Property Crime experienced an increase after Larcenies increased. Larcenies this week consisted mainly of thefts from buildings and thefts from cars.

City of Newburgh Police did not administer Narcan during the reporting period.

Calls for Service = 656

The City of Newburgh Police Department logged 656 total calls for service during the week. This was a decrease of almost 2% compared to the previous week. The most frequent call for service type for the week was "Traffic Complaint" with 19% of the call activity for the week. This was a reduction of approximately 10% over last week's levels. "Disorderly Person" was the next most frequent call type with 11% of entries. This call type showed a similar volume as the previous week.

Weapon related calls for service yielded a significant increase compared to the previous week (83%). "Shots Fired" calls had the highest volume for the week and showed an increase compared to the previous week. A Shots Fired call during the week resulted in the recovery of

two handguns. "Gun Call" entries also increased this week, while "Shooting" entries experienced a reduction.

Written Incident Reports = 105

Arrests = 43

Officers and detectives effected multiple arrests during the week to yield a total of 43 individuals arrested in the City. Notable arrests included charges for Assault 2nd, Criminal Contempt 1st, Criminal Possession of a Weapon 2nd, Grand Larceny 4th, Endangering the Welfare of a Child, Attempted Robbery 1st, Exposure of a Person, Driving While Intoxicated and Assault 3rd. Officers arrested eight people who were not residents of the City of Newburgh. These arrests accounted for 19% of the arrests for the week.
